When first-time visitors to London ask us where they should go or what they should take a look at in this amazing city, they're often left blank-faced when we advise them to take a walk along the South Bank.

They question whether a visit along Oxford Street, a trip to Trafalgar Square or a look at Piccadilly Circus wouldn't be time better spent here. In our humble opinion, little beats a ride on the London Eye, followed by a stroll next to the river, maybe taking in the Tate Modern or Borough Market along the way. There are so many astonishing, iconic buildings and sights along this redeveloped route – not least of which is the (literally) golden Sea Containers House.

►►►building issues. The drawing package grew to double that of a project this size, as standard details became broken down into a number of variations to cover building

irregularities. Floor to ceiling heights were restricted and varied, with the 12th floor being particularly low which made the mechanical and electrical design complicated. Interestingly key design features resulted from the need to conceal services such as the feature timber/leather rafts in the meeting rooms.'

Partition walls on the 12th floor, which were originally constructed to form the hotel bedroom walls, were confirmed as structural walls by the structural engineer. These were extended at low level to keep the open plan feel and provide a screen between desks.

Concluding the tour, we ask Scott Brownrigg to sum things up for us here on the South Bank. 'Although the client had little experience with a refurbishment of this type, they embraced the process and enjoyed working closely with the project team. The feedback we have received from the staff has been very complementary, the favourite features proving to be the tea/coffee and breakout spaces, the general feel and quality of light especially in the open plan areas, the meeting rooms and the WC troughs!'

Scott Brownrigg Interior Design recognised that the design detail was instrumental to creating the sought after look of refined sophistication here – and they have certainly achieved it ●
